## **Shirt History**



## **BRIEF**

The history of the colours and the shirt design has crossed many paths as can be seen from the numerous changes illustrated on this page. The official colours of the CCSA as from 1963 were Red, White and Blue.

Yellow, Green and Sky Blue was introduced in 1982 in an effort to promote a colour scheme for the Central Coast region as a whole. One, to which all sports could adopt. 35 years on, no attempt has been agreed upon, nor discussed at length. It will obviously be a prime topic, now that the two Local Councils have amalgamated to become the Central Coast Council.

The yellow did not last long and the colours reverted back to the original Red, White and Blue with Sky Blue here and there. Only with the emergence of the Mariners and, only recently, when the CCF changed its logo and colours to Navy Blue and Yellow, did yellow again appear.

Historically the colours have bounced around, mainly due to the different controlling entities who were trying to forget the past and provide a refreshing future.

The different Representative team sagas are:

1963-1993 Central Coast Reps; 1994-2003 Central Coast Coasties, 2004-2005 Central Coast United, 2006-2010 Central Coast Lightning,

2011 Central Coast FC, 2012 Central Coast Mariner's Academy, 2015 CCF, 2016-current CC Mariners,

2017 CCF entered youth Rep teams in State-wide Associations competition.

2018 the CC United name, under the umbrella of CCF, is rekindled after previous stints of the name (1970s-80s and 2005-6). The Club will cater for all age groups and play in the NSW State League. This will create two representative clubs on the Central Coast, i.e. Mariners Academy and United.
